TE-55 Parking Management for Sustainable Development (Online Course)

Parking management holds the key to achieving local land use, transportation, and sustainability objectives. Effective parking management increases the efficiency with which

parking is used, reducing the need for added parking construction, improving customer satisfaction, and reducing congestion. This online workshop provides a method for developing strategic parking management measures that fit the local context. It reviews the range of management methods available, such as pricing, shared parking, and district management, and the shows how to put those strategies into action.

Cal Poly Pomona Professor Rick Willson is leading an online course on parking management through UC Berkeley's Tech Transfer. You will learn how to develop and implement a parking management plan that matches the local context with best-practice examples from California and beyond. Such a parking management plan supports local sustainability, economic development, and livability goals.

This course grants 0.8 CEUs and 8 AICP CM credits. (AICP CMs pending approval)
