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## **NOVEMBER 2017 AICP EXAM - REDUCED FEE SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATIONS - DUE FRIDAY, AUG 18 @ 5PM**



The cost to applicants seeking to take the November 2017 AICP Exam for the first time remains at \$495, and for previously-approved applicants the cost is \$425. In order to assist exam-takers from the California Chapter with the cost of the AICP Exam, the Chapter will award **AICP Exam Reduced Fee Scholarships** in the amount of \$350 each to offset applicants' costs. Thus, those awarded the Chapter scholarships will only pay \$145 (application fee and balance of exam fee for first-time AICP Exam applicants), or \$75 (exam fee only for previously-approved AICP Exam applicants). To be eligible for an AICP Exam Reduced Fee Scholarship for the November 2017

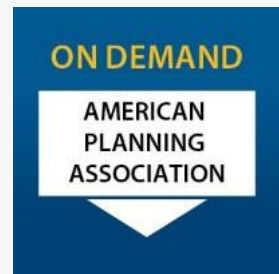
